

## **FAQs: Home Mural in Stockbridge Village**

### **Why has the mural been developed and who for?**

[Home](#) is an art project developed with Stockbridge residents, celebrating the area and its community. This public artwork aims to bring to life the creative ideas shared by local groups during workshops with artist Cherie Grist. In addition to a number of publicly advertised, drop in workshops, Cherie worked with Flourish and Succeed, The Hive, SCIP (Stockbridge Community Intergenerational Project), St Brigid's Catholic Primary School, Littlewoods of Stockbridge Association, the Junior Rangers, Meadow Park Community Orchard, Phoenix Social Group, Safari Kids Club, Stockbridge Library Colouring Group, Stockbridge Village Primary School and Young People from Skills Centre.

### **What is the artwork and where is it located?**

The artwork is a large mural located on the wall facing Waterpark Drive on the gable end of the local shops in Leach Croft. (address). In addition to the mural, a colouring book for local children has been created, featuring designs by pupils from St Brigid's Catholic Primary School and Stockbridge Village Primary School. This will be distributed for free to local school children.

### **Who made the artworks?**

Stockbridge-born artist Cherie Grist has created the artworks in collaboration with residents of Stockbridge Village. The project launched in February 2024 following consultation which took place over the past four months with over 250 Stockbridge residents. The project was commissioned by ForHousing and produced by Knowsley-based community arts organisation Heart of Glass.
